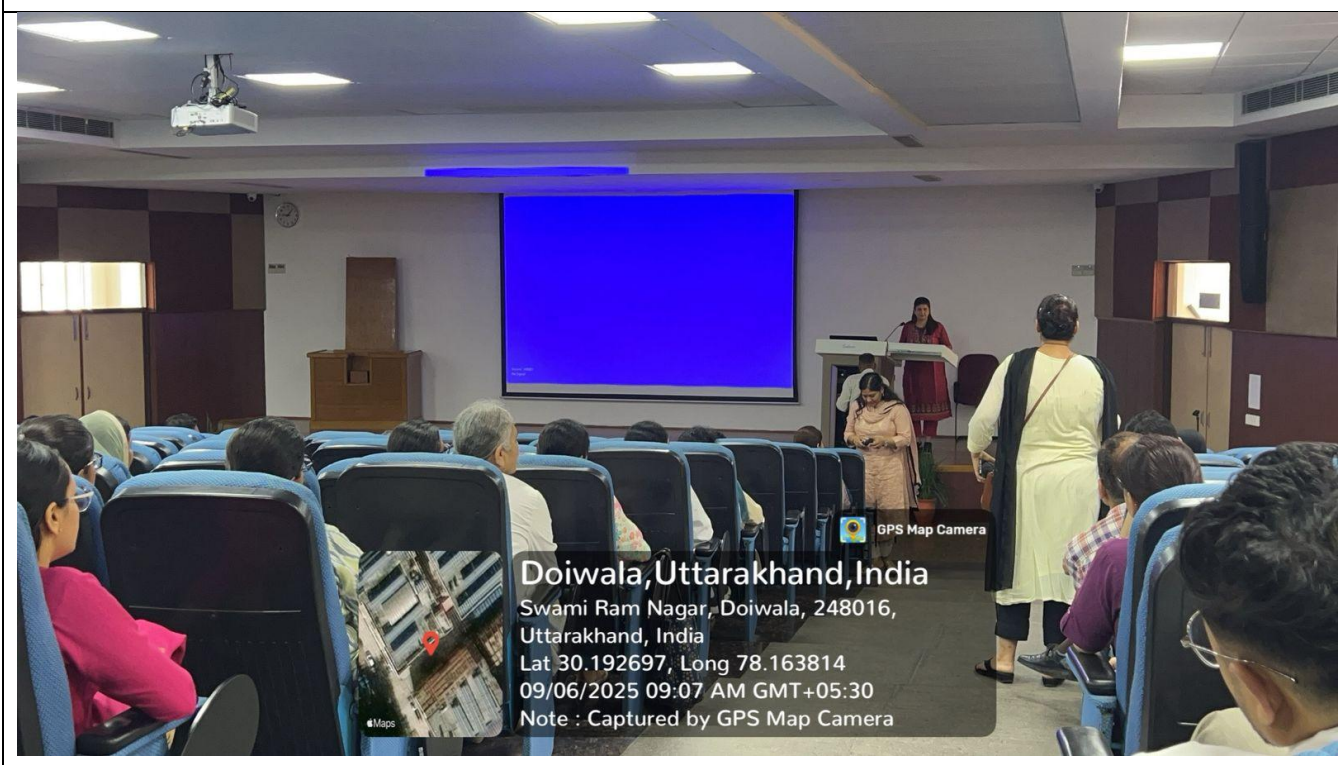


A **guest lecture** on the topic “**Restoring and Altering Voices**” was organised by the Department of Otorhinolaryngology (ENT), HIMS, SRH University, Jollygrant, Dehradun for Postgraduate students and Medical Faculty (healthcare professionals) about the diagnosis, management, and social implications of voice disorders. The session focused on how voice plays a vital role in personal identity, communication, and significantly impacts a person's quality of life-especially for professional voice users and transgender individuals.

The lecture was delivered by **Dr Nupur Kapoor Nerurkar**, an expert in Laryngology and Voice Surgery who provided detailed insights into the anatomy and physiology of voice production, common causes of voice disorders such as infections, inflammations, tumors, and neurological conditions and current treatment options including medical management, phonosurgery, and behavioural voice therapy.

The session was interactive, with active participation of Faculty members and Postgraduate students. It was concluded with a Q&A segment that addressed practical challenges and ethical considerations in voice care.
