Topic: “Slipped calculi during Lap cholecystectomy: A rare complication or overlooked reality?”

Abstract:

Laparoscopic cholecystectomy is the gold standard procedure for gall stone disease. It is one of the most common laparoscopic procedure done world-wide (40% of all laparoscopic procedures).

In 6-8% of pts of cholelithiasis there is undiagnosed choledocholithiasis due to normal CBD diameter and mildly deranged LFT. post laparoscopic cholecystectomy incidence of dropped stone leading to choledocholithiasis is about 6-10% of cases. These are typically due to factors such as multiple small stones, wide cystic duct, cystic duct calculi. Endoscopic Retrograde Cholangiopancreatography (ERCP) remains the mainstay treatment for this condition.

Complications such as Common bile duct (CBD) injury, Hemorrhage, Pancreatitis, Bowel injury are well recognized and maybe managed either conservatively or surgically, depending on severity.

Slipped stone is not considered a rare complication following cholecystectomy.

We present a case of 62-year-old lady who had slipped stone post cholecystectomy while managing that patient had further complication following which a multi-disciplinary approach was employed to address and manage the ongoing issues.
