Abstract:


Frontal lobe lesions are known to influence personality, behaviour, and executive functions profoundly. We report a rare case — a 9-year-old boy with recurrent frontal meningioma who developed striking behavioral and personality changes following multiple neurosurgical interventions. Post-operatively, he exhibited marked changes in behavior including increased talkativeness with change in linguistic preference, heightened self-esteem, distractibility, poor scholastic performance, impulsivity, and disinhibition. These symptoms resembled an ADHD-like behavioral syndrome and a “frontal lobe personality” pattern. This case illustrates the vulnerability of the developing brain to insults, especially within the frontal regions responsible for regulation of impulse control, attention, and social behavior. As per DSM-5 code 310.1 — Personality Change Due to Another Medical Condition (Disinhibited Type), characterized by impulsivity, socially inappropriate conduct, and heightened emotional expression directly attributable to frontal injury. In ICD-11, this corresponds to 6E60 — Mental or behavioral disorder due to known physiological condition.
