The Vice Chancellor also instructed the HR Dept to make sure that Swami Ji's video is played during the induction session and the vision, mission and values be introduced.

The Vice Chancellor further suggested that all the faculty members must go through the New Education Policy (NEP) and requested Dr Saklani to send him salient features of the same. He also mentioned that main elements of the UGC dual degree program should be worked out by the Principals under the Chairmanship of the Pro Vice Chancellor.

The Coordinator of IQAC, Dr. Jayanti Semwal, presented the ATR before the IQAC members.

**Item 8/3: Implementation of choice-based Credit System (CBCS).**

Pro Vice chancellor apprised the members that the CBCS guidelines have been shared with all academic units. The new Regulations for CBCS have been implemented in all the programs conducted by the University, except for those which are governed by the statutory councils.

**Item 8/4: Admissions for batch 2021 along with number of applications received for each program (no. of seats filled as per SC / ST / OBC and general categories)**

Dr Deepa Singh apprised the members on the admissions for 2021 batch for each program under various Academic Units.

**Item 8/5: To review the existing scholarships & fee concessions given to students along with number of beneficiaries for the years 2021; policies suggestions are welcomed for any improvement.**

The Registrar apprised the members on the existing scholarships & fee concessions given to students along with the number of beneficiaries for the year 2021.

Existing Policies: Year 2021

- One- time relaxation of 25% in tuition fee
- Performance based Scholarship.
- Merit cum means scholarship is in the process of finalization.

The Registrar also apprised the members that a policy for the new scholarships has been approved by the board of management and will be circulated very soon.

**Item 8/6: Apprise the members about:**

- (a) Identification of and intervention for advanced learners & slow performers. Details (program wise) along with detailed remedial classes conducted by faculty with a number of students.**

The Registrar apprised the members that the Guidelines for advanced learners & slow performers were prepared and placed before the Academic Council & Board of Management. There were some useful suggestions given by the Board of Management and the Guidelines have been revised accordingly & circulated on 2<sup>nd</sup> May, 2022 by the Registrar among all the Academic Units.

- b) Format for Mentoring & number of mentors allocated all over the University along with students (Ratio)**

The Vice Chancellor asked the members whether we have any kind of system for getting genuine student feedback on mentoring. The Vice Chancellor further suggested that regular workshops with students should be held for the same.

The Vice Chancellor also mentioned that issues related to student mentoring should be discussed & resolved in academic units and mail be sent to all mentors for the creation of WhatsApp group.

Dr. Deepa Singh presented the format prepared for maintaining the mentor's logbook and apprised the members of the communication sent to all academic Unit heads to submit the logbooks.

Dr Singh further informed that new mentor-mentee allocation for the year 2021-22 has been done in all units (new students added & passed out students removed) but those in Supplementary category have been retained. Dr. Singh also apprised the members about the number of mentors allocated all over the University along with mentor-mentee Ratio.

- c) Capability Enhancement & Life Skills Development activities conducted by different schools over the years along with a number of students participated.**

Dr. R. C Ramola apprised the members that a total 68 activities were conducted till date under the scheme of Capability Enhancement and Life Skills. Out of this 50 were conducted in 2021 and 18 by April 2022. Every unit has prepared an activity calendar and accordingly they are conducting their activities. Dr. R.

C Ramola also apprised that a guideline has been provided to each unit with a minimum number of activities to be conducted under this scheme.

Skills like soft skills and yoga & wellness which are a part of the curriculum in some units such as HSMS and HSST, are separately conducting the activities.

**d) Incentives/ appreciation letters/ names of the faculty on SRHU website for faculty members who are recipients of State / National / International Awards / Recognition.**

Dr Deepa Singh apprised the members about the number of faculty members who are recipients of State / National / International Awards / Recognition.

Dr. Juhi Kalra apprised the members about the VACs conducted in all Academic units during 2021-22.

The Vice Chancellor advised that SRHU is working on a water & sanitation program (WATSON) and is providing training to other states, as well. The training related to the water and sanitation program should be included in the VAC and accordingly conducted.

**Item 8/8: To report on an Audit done by the Hospital Infection Control Committee at Himalayan Hospital.**

Dr. Garima apprised the members about the Audits done by the Hospital Infection Control Committee at Himalayan Hospital and presented the report on the Audit.

The various audits done by HICC are:

1. Hand Hygiene compliance: every month
2. Infection control bundles:
  - a. Catheter associated urinary tract infection: every month
  - b. Surgical site infection: every month
  - c. Central line associated bloodstream infection: every month
  - d. Ventilator associated pneumonia: every month
3. Needle stick injury and blood body fluid exposure: every month
4. Hepatitis B vaccination compliance: every month
5. Antimicrobial stewardship program
  - a. Antibiotic policy updation: every year
  - b. Antibiograms : every year
  - c. Antibiotic audits (IPD and OPD): quarterly
6. Biomedical waste audit





- a. Internal hospital audits: every month
  - b. External waste facility: every six months
7. Other activities: Teaching of doctors, nurses, technicians, house-keepers, ward attendants etc.

The Vice Chancellor praised the work done by the Hospital Infection Control Committee at Himalayan Hospital and suggested that there should be regular training programs for relevant staff. Also, all the MBBS students must be aware about the Hospital Infection Control program.

**Item 8/9: Report on the number of days taken by the examination department for taking out results for each program & overall average day's semester wise.**

Dr. Archana apprised the members about the days taken by the examination department for declaration of results

**(Exam report of 2021-2022 Annexure 9)**

The Vice Chancellor praised Dr. Archana Prakash and her department for their good pace and timely declaration of results.

Dr. Anuradha raised an issue in paramedical exam marks rechecking, where they have only retotaling facility (not rechecking). The Vice Chancellor suggested creating a system for resolving it.

**Item 8/10: Review of the progress of LMS and Automation of Examination Systems**

Learning Management System:

Mr Deepak Negi apprised the members that different systems were evaluated for LMS and eAbyas solution has been shortlisted in consultation with NAAC team. eAbyas solution is based on Industry Standard platform Moodle and has been selected on the basis of functionality, cost, Team capability and current client base.

Mr Deepak Negi apprised the members that the eAbyas team had visited SRHU from Hyderabad and a demo was conducted with Deans of all the Colleges. In the coming week, one more demo will be planned to see more detailed functionality of LMS using SRHU sample courses, structure and setup.

Automation of Examination System:

Mr. Deepak Negi apprised the members that Automated Examination Management System was part of Himshikhar and covered pre-exam, Exam conduct, post-exam except online-proctoring.

After the unsuccessful delivery of ERP to SRHU by Himshikhar, another organization viz. Littlemore Innovation (Singapore based entity) was evaluated by the NAAC team.

Mr. Deepak Negi apprised the members that the IT team is working to resolve the issue of shortage of IT staff in the organization which is causing delay in the implementation of Exam Management system.



**Item 8/11: Brief report on Seed money, Research grants received from Govt., Non Govt. agencies from 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022 by different faculty.**

The Pro VC apprised the members on the seed money and Research grants received from Govt. and Non Govt. agencies by different faculty members, as follows.

The Vice Chancellor advised Officer in-Charge, Research & Ph.D. Cell to organize a Research conclave, which was earlier suggested by Dr. Vinita Kalra, soon.

**Item 8/12: Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences (HIMS) participation in National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)-2022.**

The Registrar apprised the members that Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences (HIMS) has participated in NIRF - 2022 and result of the same is awaited.

**Item 8/13: Any other point with the permission of the chair.**

Some suggestions came from the members:

- (a) Dr. Lekha suggested that an orientation must be given to all students about the VAC.
- (b) Dr. S.L Jethani suggested that all the students (either Medical or Non - Medical) must be experts in Basic life support in the context of VAC.
- (c) Ms. Prabhjot raised the issues of not receiving / submission of the faculty teaching feedback of students in the HR Department. Dr Saklani submitted that the feedback reports are shared with the Dean who is requested to further share with HODs/ faculty members, individually however in some cases it has been observed that it was not reaching the HoDs. For this, it was suggested by VC that sharing of feedback with individual faculty members must be ensured but also that it is not supposed to be considered as a tool for penalizing instead it is to be used as an opportunity to help improve teaching quality, as the case may be.

The Vice Chancellor further instructed that this feedback report, once prepared, should be shared with the HR department, as well. He also advised to initiate the peer review / appraisal as well.

Ms. Prabhjot also drew the attention of the house towards the high attrition rate in the Nursing department. The Vice Chancellor advised to include stress related courses in VAC and start implementation especially in those departments where attrition rate is high and reason of attrition is stress e.g. nursing.



- (d) Mr. Yogendra Singh raised the noise issues in the Library hall coming from the Mess. The Vice Chancellor observed that he has noted this matter and a team is working to resolve it.
- (e) The Vice Chancellor suggested that MBBS students and Residents must participate more actively in the VACs.
- (f) Dr Juhi suggested that feedback on curriculum should be followed up by taking required action.
- (g) Dr Chauhan suggested that the University should have its E-Waste Management policy.
- (h) Dean Research advised the existing Research Promotion Policy-2018 should be reviewed & revised.

The Vice Chancellor thanked all the members of the IQAC for their valuable inputs and suggestions. No further discussion took place and the meeting ended with a 'Vote of thanks to the Chair'.

**Item 7/3 (III):** Faculty awareness regarding Programme Outcome / Course Outcome:

**Response:** Workshop conducted for all academic units' two workshops were organized.

**Item 7/4:** Implementation of National Education Policy [NEP-2020]

**Response:** Two workshops were organized for education policy and its implementation.

The guideline for implementation of "National Education Policy-2020" is under preparation for those programs of the University which are not governed by the regulatory body.

**Item 7/5:** Review of special programs of advance learner and slow performers

**Response:** The Policy/ Guidelines are under preparation.

**Item 7/7:** To review the student feedback (obtained online) for teaching-learning and its implementation

**Response:** A brainstorming session was organized with all the Heads of the Academic Units. It was decided that:

- Feedback to be simplified
- Timely
- To be conducted in consultation with each Academic Unit/ Departments
- Issues like repeated login to be resolved with IT Team.
- Student feedback is only one of the parameters to assess the quality of teaching. The purpose is to help the teacher to improve teaching and make learning an enjoyable process.



**Item 7/11:** PhD Program

**Response:** Feedback from PhD students taken. Guidelines are being prepared and a list of PhD guide is in the process of being prepared.

**Item 7/18:** Sports and cultural activities / events/ competitions organized in the Institution

**Response:** The activity calendar for the year 2022 has been circulated as “Days of importance”. Chairpersons of Cultural committee, Sports Committee and Literary & Fine Arts Committee have already been requested to organize the different activities at regional/state/national level.

**Item 7/22:** Progress on NAD

**Response:** As Digi-locker become the mandatory depository for implementation of NAD, the University has registered with NAD and Registrar is the Nodal Officer.

The competent authority decided to initiate the implementation of NAD by uploading the Degree of the students. The template for uploading the same is finalized and shortly the process of uploading of degrees of the students on NAD depository will be initiated by COE office.

**Item 7/23:** Any other point with the permission of the Chair

**Response:** The issue of visibility of the library link on the University Website was discussed with OSD to VC. She assured to check the feasibility as university website is under upgradation.

Regular updates from the SRHU library to all departments regarding new books, journals and events at the library were done.

Clear Instructions to faculty on correct nomenclature of University in research publications have been given.
