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## REPORT

**Venue** : Himalyan School of Science and Technology, Swami Rama Himalayan University  
**Time** : 10:00AM Onwards

The Model United Nation Club of Swami Rama Himalayan University on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of May 2024 at the HSST Reading Room, focusing on the agenda "*Food Insecurity and Malnutrition in Developing and Underdeveloped Countries*" with the motto "*Feed Today, Be Nourished Forever.*" Prior to the event, a series of preparatory meetings were conducted to introduce the MUN concept to university principals, obtain necessary approvals, finalize policies, objectives, and event timelines, and assign responsibilities to the organizing team. Discussions also included budget planning, certification costs, the proposal for mock sessions, Google Meet orientations, and selection of schools and colleges for promotional outreach. Delegate communication platforms were established through form creation and WhatsApp groups, while country allocations and member feedback helped refine the planning process. These meetings also emphasized strategies for future MUN events at the university.

The event commenced on 15th May 2024 with an opening ceremony from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Gurmanjot Kaur, the Chairperson, delivered a detailed introduction to MUN rules and regulations, followed by Vice Chairperson Daksh Sharma, who elaborated on procedural aspects to ensure clarity among delegates. Anchors Ankita and Gaurvi officially welcomed the participants and introduced the event flow. Executive Board Head Gaurav Nath highlighted the importance of the agenda, while President Smit Sharma and Vice President Aditya Pyakurel encouraged delegates to engage meaningfully in debates and collaborative discussions. The Delegate of Cambodia initiated the General Speakers' List (GSL), which was passed and opened the formal debate. Delegates from France, Saudi Arabia, Australia, Japan, Italy, Switzerland, China, and Cambodia presented well-articulated speeches, with active Points of Information exchanged—most notably between Japan, France, and Saudi Arabia. The Delegate of Russia successfully motioned for a 30-minute unmoderated caucus, enabling informal collaboration and strategy building. Outstanding contributions were observed, particularly from the Delegate of Germany, whose well-researched and impactful GSL speech stood out. The first day concluded with a strong foundation of structured debate, insightful discussions, and active participation.

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The second day, held on 16th May 2024 from 9:18 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., introduced an intense crisis scenario in which France was accused of contaminating food in Nigeria, resulting in massive casualties and geopolitical tensions. Supported by an alliance consisting of Japan, Australia, Russia, and India, Nigeria prepared for potential conflict while France denied all allegations. Delegates of France and Nigeria were tasked with forming alliances and leading diplomatic negotiations, which resulted in some of the most dynamic and confident debates of the entire event. Delegates collectively worked toward drafting resolutions to de-escalate tensions and address the crisis. The crisis simulation provided an opportunity for delegates to apply analytical, diplomatic, and problem-solving skills in a high-pressure environment, displaying exceptional teamwork and strategic thinking. The day concluded with meaningful resolutions and strengthened collaboration among participants.

Delegate feedback highlighted the event's educational impact, professionalism, and the tremendous support of the Executive Board. Many appreciated the platform's ability to enhance public speaking, research, diplomacy, and confidence, while also enabling them to build friendships and engage with diverse perspectives. Several delegates expressed eagerness for more frequent MUN events across the university. The prize distribution ceremony marked the culmination of the two-day event, with dignitaries including Hon'ble Registrar Dr. Rajendra Dobhal and Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Mukesh Bijalwan distributing awards. The Best Delegate was awarded to Mansi Gururani (France), Best Position Paper to Bhumi Pathak (Nigeria), High Commendation to Tushar Chand (Australia), and Special Mention to Antriksh Raturi (Russia). Verbal Mentions were awarded to Aditya Pratap Singh (Japan), Anshika Barthwal (Congo), and Gungun Goyal (Germany).

The Envisage MUN 2024 successfully achieved its aim of fostering global awareness, leadership, negotiation skills, and international understanding. The professional conduct, enthusiastic participation, and positive feedback from delegates highlighted the significance of events like MUN in enriching student development. The organizing committee expressed gratitude to all participants, faculty, and administrative members for their support and looks forward to hosting future editions that continue to inspire academic excellence and global citizenship.

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## REPORT

A series of seven orientation sessions were organized by the MUN Club of Swami Rama Himalayan University from 2nd to 10th August 2024 to build momentum and encourage widespread participation in upcoming SRHU MUN events. The primary objective was to introduce students to the Model United Nations framework, its relevance in fostering diplomacy, critical thinking, research skills, and awareness of global affairs, along with a focused introduction to the structure and vision of SRHU MUN.

The first session was conducted on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2024 at the Himalayan School of Bio Sciences, where students enthusiastically participated in interactive presentations designed to explain the fundamentals of MUN. Engaging activities and brief simulation games helped students grasp committee dynamics, and constructive feedback was collected to assess their interest. The second session, held on 3rd August 2024 at the Himalayan School of Yoga Sciences, witnessed equal enthusiasm, with students actively participating in the activities and expressing positive feedback regarding their understanding of the MUN process.

On 5<sup>th</sup> August 2024, the orientation moved to the Himalayan School of Management Studies targeting MBA and B.Com students. The session highlighted the applicability of MUN in developing managerial competencies such as negotiation, leadership, teamwork, and decision-making. Students explored global economic issues through interactive exercises, which strengthened their understanding of international policy-making. The fourth session, held on 6th August 2024 at the Himalayan School of Science and Technology, focused on integrating technical knowledge with MUN diplomacy. Students participated in analytical games that linked technological innovation with global problem-solving, and the feedback indicated strong appreciation for this interdisciplinary approach.

The fifth session on 7th August 2024 again engaged students of the Himalayan School of Management Studies, this time focusing on BBA students. The session emphasized the significance of understanding global markets, international business policies, and economic diplomacy. Students showed strong interest during the interactive exercises, particularly those involving economic decision-making from the perspective of various countries. The sixth session on 8th August 2024 at the Himalayan School of Pharmaceutical Sciences introduced students to the concept of global health diplomacy. The session effectively connected MUN simulations to international health regulations, pharmaceutical policies, and global health challenges, generating a keen interest among participants.

The final session of the orientation series was held on 10th August 2024 at the Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences for paramedical students. This session emphasized the intersection of medical sciences and global health governance, enabling students to understand how international bodies address health crises. Students actively participated in discussions, and their feedback reflected enthusiasm for future involvement in MUN activities.

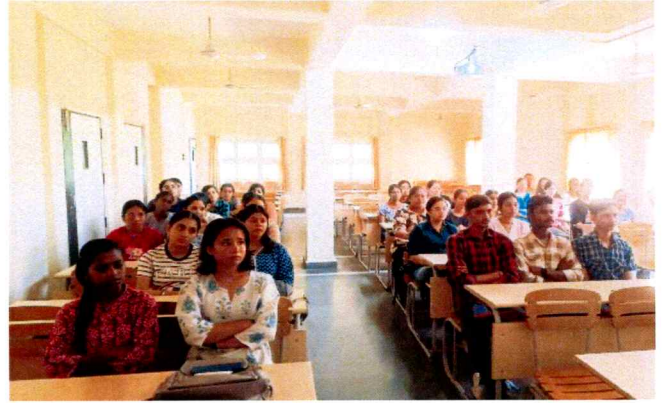
