8.	<b>Duties and function</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a) Conduct workshops and mock elections to simulate the voting process</li><li>b) Facilitate voter registration drives in collaboration with the District Election Office</li><li>c) Organize debates, quizzes, and exhibitions on democracy, governance, and electoral ethics</li><li>d) Create multilingual IEC materials and digital content to promote voter awareness</li><li>e) Celebrate National Voters' Day and other observances with pledge ceremonies and outreach events</li></ul>
9.	<b>Funding and Resources</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. Institutional budget allocation</li><li>b. Donations and sponsorships</li></ul>
10.	<b>Amendments</b>	Any amendment to this club must be proposed in writing and approved by a two-thirds majority of the Electoral Literacy Club (ELC).

### Report on Observance of Constitution Day 2024 at HCN

**Date:** November 26 & 29, 2024

**Organized by:** Literary and Fine Arts Committee, Himalayan College of Nursing, in association with the University Electoral Literacy Committee & Office of the Assistant Registrar (Legal), Swami Rama Himalayan University

**Activity:**

The Literary and Fine Arts Committee of Himalayan College of Nursing, in association with the University Electoral Literacy Committee and the Office of the Assistant Registrar (Legal), SRHU, organized a two-day observance of Constitution Day 2024 to promote constitutional awareness and civic responsibility among nursing students.

On November 26, 2024, an Oath Ceremony was conducted for B.Sc. Nursing I Semester students. Students pledged to uphold the values of the Indian Constitution, reinforcing their role as responsible citizens and future healthcare professionals.

On November 29, 2024, an Educational Talk was delivered by Mr. Piyush Dhyani, Assistant Registrar (Legal), SRHU, for B.Sc. Nursing V Semester students. The talk covered an introduction to the Constitution of India, its historical background, relevance in nursing and healthcare, and an overview of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, enabling students to clarify doubts and engage in meaningful discussions on legal and ethical responsibilities.

Students were also made aware about their voting rights and role as informed and responsible citizens in a democracy



The observance effectively reinforced the importance of democratic values, voting rights, and democratic participation, legal literacy, and constitutional ethics in the professional and personal lives of nursing students.
