- Facilitate health camps and screening events at outreach centers like RHTC Kurkawala and UHTC Rishikesh.
- Create digital content (videos, infographics) in Hindi/Garhwali to promote health messages on SRHU platforms.
- Celebrate World Population Day and other observances with community talks and IEC material distribution.



Report on Autism Awareness Workshop

On April 5, 2024, the HEALTH EDUCATION & AWARENESS CLUB (Public Health, Social Welfare, & Community Outreach Clubs), Rural Development Institute, Himalayan University, organized an awareness workshop on Autism at the Community Health Centre, Bahadrabad. The workshop was attended by over 60 ASHA and Anganwadi workers, aiming to enhance their understanding of autism, promote early identification, and strengthen community-based support for children with developmental challenges. During the workshop, Dr. Anil Rawat (Head, Department of Pediatrics) highlighted the need for autism awareness, explaining that it is a neurological condition affecting communication, imagination, and social interaction in children. Dr. Nirul (Pediatric Specialist) elaborated those autistic children often experience delayed speech, repeat words, and need to be integrated into social activities. Dr. Rakesh (Pediatric Specialist) explained that these children may struggle with eye contact, comprehension, and daily activities, emphasizing the crucial role of parents' involvement and care.

On this occasion, Dr. Subodh Joshi (Health Superintendent, Bahadrabad) appreciated the initiatives run by Himalayan University in the Bahadrabad area. The Awareness workshop was facilitated by Ms. Neelam Pandey (Programme Officer), who shared that the theme for Autism Awareness this year is “Empowering Autistic Individuals”, aimed at providing greater support and strength to children with autism. Mr. Ravindra Verma (Co-Programme Officer) delivered the vote of thanks, highlighting the importance of maternal awareness and preventive check-ups to ensure early detection of autism. The programme concluded with an interactive session, encouraging ASHA and Anganwadi workers to spread awareness in the community, ensuring that children with autism receive timely support and opportunities for growth.





On December 3, 2024, the **HEALTH EDUCATION & AWARENESS CLUB** (*Public Health, Social Welfare, & Community Outreach Clubs*) Rural Development Institute, in collaboration with HIHT/SRHU, celebrated the International Day of Persons with Disabilities under the theme *“Promoting the Leadership of Persons with Disabilities for an Inclusive and Sustainable Future.”* The event, attended by around 70 persons with disabilities and their families, highlighted the education and awareness on their rights, leadership, and contributions to society. Distinguished guests, including Dr. Vijayendra Chauhan (Director, Himalayan Institute Academy), Dr. Jainendra Kumar and Santosh Kumar (NCSC), and Dr. Ashwin Bhatt (Neurologist, HIHT), emphasized the importance of inclusion and leadership. Student volunteered actively in celebration and communicated with beneficiaries regarding Mobility aids, such as wheelchairs, tricycles, and crutches, as well as economic support items like sewing machines and carts, were distributed, along with scholarships and disability certificates. The event symbolized not just a day of celebration but the Institute’s year-round commitment to inclusive development, rehabilitation, education, skill-building, and empowerment, working toward a more equitable and sustainable future for all.
