


The Centre for Professional & Communication Enrichment is organizing an engaging series of activities for the 1st year students of SRHU as part of the Orientation Programme.

Brainstorming and Planning for Orientation

Following the successful execution of Envisage MUN, the team immediately transitioned into strategic discussions on the future course of SRHU MUN activities on July 18th & 26th, 2024. A key outcome of these discussions was the decision to conduct an orientation session for first-year students across various schools at SRHU. The aim was to increase awareness of MUN and the specific vision of SRHU MUN, thereby creating a foundation for future participation.



Orientation Sessions across SRHU Colleges

(Academic Year 2024)

To build momentum and foster participation in future MUN events, a series of orientation sessions were conducted in August 2024. Each session included a comprehensive presentation on the concept of MUN, its importance in developing critical thinking, diplomacy skills, and knowledge of international relations, as well as a focused introduction to SRHU MUN.

Day 1: Himalayan School of Bio Sciences (02/08/2024)

The first orientation session was held at the Himalayan School of Bio Sciences, where students were introduced to the MUN framework through interactive presentations and engaging activities. The students showed keen interest, participating in games presented. A feedback session was conducted to gauge the students' level of interest and understanding.



Day 2: Himalayan School of Yoga Sciences (03/08/2024)

The second session took place at the Himalayan School of Yoga Sciences, where the students were equally enthusiastic. The MUN concept was presented, followed by interactive activities. The session concluded with feedback from the students, which was overwhelmingly positive.



Day 3: Himalayan School of Management Studies – MBA and B.Com Students (05/08/2024)

On the third day, the orientation session took place at the Himalayan School of Management Studies, focusing on engaging MBA and B.Com students. The presentation was structured to demonstrate the relevance of MUN to management students, particularly in developing leadership, decision-making, and negotiation skills. Students were encouraged to tackle real-world issues from a business and economic perspective, fostering a deeper understanding of global policies and international trade.



Day 4: Himalayan School of Science and Technology (06/08/2024)

The fourth orientation session was held at the Himalayan School of Science and Technology. Here, the focus was on demonstrating how technical knowledge can be integrated with diplomatic negotiations, providing a unique perspective on the MUN experience. Students were particularly engaged in the interactive games, which challenged them to apply their knowledge in a diplomatic context. Day 5: Himalayan School of Management Studies – BBA Students (07/08/2024)

Returning to the Himalayan School of Management Studies, this session targeted BBA students. The presentation emphasized the importance of understanding global economic policies and their impact on international relations. The interactive games facilitated discussions on economic diplomacy, and the students' feedback reflected their eagerness to explore these concepts further through SRHU MUN.



Day 6: Himalayan School of Pharmaceutical Sciences (08/08/2024)

At the Himalayan School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, the orientation session was tailored to connect the MUN concept with global health diplomacy. The presentation covered how MUN simulations could help future pharmaceutical professionals understand the complexities of international health policies. Feedback from this session indicated a strong interest in continuing the dialogue through future MUN events.



Day 7: Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences – Paramedical Students (10/08/2024)

The final orientation session was conducted at the Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, where paramedical students were introduced to the MUN framework. The presentation focused on the intersection of medical knowledge and international health policy, encouraging students to consider the global implications of their field.
